

Slain Man's Family Offers Reward For Clues To Killers

In an effort to solve the murder of an Eastside man last Thursday, relatives have offered a reward and have hired an investigation agency.

Peter McKinnon, 36, of 1843 Oak St., was discovered lying face-down near the edge of the front yard at 1123 Atcheson St., police said. McKinnon was pronounced dead at the scene from multiple gunshot wounds to the head and neck, police said.

Services were held Tuesday for McKinnon, a licensed contractor, at the Chapel of the McNabb Funeral Home.

The CALL & POST has learned that ATH Investigation Agency has been hired by the McKinnon Family to help find the murderer or murderers.

Office in the Bryson Building, an investigator said that a \$2,000 reward has been offered for information leading to the conviction of the murderer. He said a \$1,000 reward will be paid for any information

that could prove a witness has lied during questioning in the investigation. The investigator wished to remain unidentified.

The investigator said an eyewitness reported hearing three shots fired at about 9:40 p.m. in the vicinity where McKinnon was found. According to the unidentified witness a light green 1977 Cadillac Coupe DeVille (possible white landau roof) was seen speeding east on Atcheson Street immediately after the shots were fired. The cars lights were on, the witness said.

Three black men were spotted leaning over the front portion of McKinnon's body before the shots were fired, the investigator said. "There may have been others in-
